


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About Career & College Prep

Project-Based Learning

Project Based Learning (PBL) is a research-based instructional methodology where students are presented with real-world problems or challenges and seek solutions through authentic learning experiences. Many students find PBL to be rigorous, challenging, and engaging while providing better preparation for their ongoing academic journey and professional careers. In addition to covering academic standards, PBL is designed to integrate Durable Skills to ensure our students are well-equipped for future opportunities.

Virtual Job Shadowing

One of the most unique opportunities we offer at K12 Private Academy College and Career Prep is the opportunity to participate in sessions with professionals from a wide range of industries where they share about a day-in-the-life of their job, the education/training required, and the skills and traits needed for success in their job. Students may request virtual Job Shadows that relate to a career interest.

Middle School Program

In addition to a student's core coursework, middle school students are also encouraged to participate in our middle school pathway and to earn certifications along the way. During this exploratory phase in their education, students are highly encouraged to also take advantage of the live virtual job shadows and other career-focused activities.

A primary goal for students in the Career & College program at K12 Private Academy is to complete a sequence of courses that will help prepare them for future success in a career field of interest. We currently offer 12 pathways in the following disciplines:

Declaring a Pathway

Students are encouraged to declare a pathway upon enrollment. In order to have time to complete a pathway, students MUST choose a pathway by the start of 11th grade. Declarations can be made by emailing your School Counselor or CRE Coordinator.

Completing a Pathway

Students must earn a minimum of four high school credits in their chosen pathway in order to be considered a pathway completer. Within those four credits, there are opportunities for Work-Based Learning and advanced learning opportunities (certain AP & dual enrollment courses). Students should work with their school counselor to select courses that will work toward satisfying completion requirements.

What do I get for completing a pathway?

Students who complete a Career & College pathway distinguish themselves in many ways:

- Recognition at graduation.
- Earn a certificate of completion.
- Earn an additional seal on diploma.
- Include on resume for college and employment.

Pathway Course Plans

The next several pages outline the recommended course sequences for each pathway offered. Students are encouraged to work with their School Counselor to come up with plans that meet their specific interests & goals.

- Many core courses and electives are available as <u>Honors, AP, and/or Dual</u> <u>Enrollment</u> courses. Certain alternatives may be available when discussed with the School Counselor.
- Many upper-level or Level 2 Career Courses are eligible for certifications. Students are strongly encouraged to complete the certification following the course.







Work-Based Learning WBL531

0.5 credits per section, earn a total of 1.0 credits over two semesters.

Students who have paid employment, operate their own small business, unpaid internship or volunteer, or apprenticeship may qualify for this elective work-based learning course. Throughout the course, you will learn from your work experience to develop skills and gain experience, and different aspects of the workplace. This course has four major components.

- Required meeting with the instructor.
- Required 70 hours of work experience.
- Self-reflection, and evaluation of essential workplace skills (Throughout the semester, you will be asked to reflect on your experiences and evaluate your progress. This self-reflection will help you identify areas where you need to improve and strengths you can build on in the future).

Internship WBL511

No Credit

Designed for high school students who are interested in gaining real-world work experience and exploring potential career paths who will complete LESS than 60 working hours during the semester. Through an internship with a local organization or business, students will have the opportunity to apply classroom learning to a professional setting and gain practical skills and knowledge. Students will be responsible for securing their own internship placement, with guidance and support from the instructor. The internship must be with a reputable organization or business and must align with the student's career interests and goals. Students will be required to meet with the instructor regularly to discuss their progress and reflect on their experiences. The length of the student internship experience may vary, but all students must complete a **minimum of five hours** of internship.

Work Experience 2 WBL532

No Credit

This course does not include any assignments or required activities. This support classroom is designed to record the names of students who have received recognition for volunteering, work experiences, internships, or participation in at least three hours of virtual job shadowing. This support classroom is not for credit and does not require attendance. Its primary purpose is to track and acknowledge students during their graduation year. Please notify your school counselor or Ms. Day if you are participating in any activity that may qualify and you can be placed in this support classroom. Students may occasionally receive announcements about upcoming events or activities of interest, but participation is optional.


